



## **Photographer Checklist**

Thank you for your willingness to photograph our Abrahamic Reunion Community Service! Your photography will be published online both at <u>abrahamicalliance.org</u> and on Facebook to spread a message of hope that Jews, Christians and Muslims cannot only peacefully coexist, but we can unite to serve the poor for the glory of God, kavod Hashem, الحَمْدُ فَدُونُ اللهُ Seeing is believing, so your photography is crucially important to advance international peacebuilding as people around the world long for similar events to occur in their locale.

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PREPAI	RATION
	To insure the privacy, dignity and security of homeless guests and shelter residents, <b>please do not</b>
	photograph their faces. If their hands or backs only are visible in a picture of volunteers, no problem.
	Verify your camera is <b>set to</b> take the <b>highest quality/resolution images</b> possible.
	Verify camera <b>date</b> , <b>hour and minute settings</b> are correct to insure accurate EXIF time stamps on all pics. Please ensure your camera lens is <b>clean</b> .
	Enable <b>silent mode</b> on your camera so as not to distract others at quiet event times, e.g., during prayer.
	There might be an additional photographer helping you cover your event . If so, you two will form a
	"buddy group", so feel free to get acquainted as you work together.
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PLEASE	TAKE PHOTOS OF:
	Community <b>leaders welcoming</b> volunteers before the event begins
	Each community leader addressing volunteers during orientation
	Buddy groups getting acquainted in conversation during orientation
	Buddy groups <u>looking at your camera</u> and <u>smiling</u> while getting acquainted, working, serving, and
_	dining together. Say "Smile!" to get their attention. Don't be shy. These pictures are important.
	<b>Group picture</b> . After orientation, direct volunteers to a place with good lighting where you can arrange
	all into several rows (kneeling, sitting and standing), allowing you to be as close as possible. Count to 3
	so people know when <i>not</i> to blink. Then say something <i>real</i> funny to get a group pic with BIG smiles,
_	e.g., "Imagine your favorite team just won the superbowl, world cup, or world series—on 3? 1, 2, 3!"
	Buddy groups working together
	Buddy groups serving together
	Buddy groups dining together
	Buildings hosting the event: outside from a distance, entry, get signage showing name of facility.
	<b>Prayers/blessings/dua</b> (if offered). <b>Check agenda</b> and be ready to photograph each person or group who
_	offers a prayer before volunteers and/or guests. Be discreet and reverent.
	<b>Event leaders group</b> . Bring event leaders together to take a group photo of them together when things slow down a bit (their names are on your agenda).
	<b>Buddy groups conversing</b> over their meal, then interrupt them briefly by saying "SMILE!" ©
	All leaders who address volunteers while dining at event end.
	<b>Album cover pic:</b> The best pic of the event will appear on the home page of <u>abrahamicalliance.org</u> and
	be used as an photo album cover. It will be cropped 16:9 widescreen. Album cover shots generally have
	at least 5 volunteers (with at least one from each community) in action working/serving together and
	looking directly at the camera with big smiles.
